Western Australia's Eastern Goldfields history began at Southern Cross.

Visit the Museum housed in the heritage building constructed in 1892 – the oldest Government building east of Northam – which was the Mining Registrar's Office and Courthouse. "Look for Gold towards the constellation of the Southern Cross" they said. And there it was found.

From here began the Gold Rush to Coolgardie, and the richest cubic mile of earth in the world, Kalgoorlie's Golden Mile. Arthur Bayley and Paddy Hannan both registered their claims for Coolgardie and Kalgoorlie at the Southern Cross Mining Registrar's Office. Because of this Southern Cross is often referred to as the Mother of Coolgardie and Grandmother of Kalgoorlie.

Southern Cross, standing as it does where the Wheatbelt meets the Goldfields, is in a unique position and its History Museum contains a collection of artefacts, records and memorabilia from both areas.


